

Remembering Dr. Bill Lawrence

Born May 25, 1920 - Died March 11, 2006

Dr. Bill was born in Salinas, CA and took his pre-med training at Santa Clara University. Later he received his M.D. from Creighton Univ., Omaha, NE. Upon graduation he returned to Valley Medical Hospital in San Jose to complete his internship. Because of WWII, he immediately entered the army and was assigned to Oklahoma and then to posts in Philippines and Japan. Upon discharge he opened his practice of 51 years in San Jose.

Dr. Bill was an avid antique car "nut". He collected and restored numerous pre-1916 cars and even a 1920s fire engine. He was active in the Santa Clara Valley Chapter of the Horseless Carriage Club of America (HCCA) and also served as its national president.

Bill and his wife, Betty, joined the Katydids in the late 1970s and went inactive in Nov. 1995. Because of Betty's problem with her legs they resigned in 1997. Dr. Bill returned in 2000 with Adele Baker as his dance partner (Adele Baker and husband, Bill, were also Katydids about the same time and fellow members of HCCA. Bill has since passed on earlier to be with the Lord.) Because of his own stamina problem they resigned from Katydids around June 2002.

For many, many years the Lawrence's hosted the after-party at their lovely spacious home in Saratoga. The after-party has been a tradition after we completed our Sweetheart Hoedown where we can relax, have refreshments and reminisce about our successful hoedown.

Thank you Dr. Bill and Betty for sharing your glorious life with us.


March 2

March 8, 2006



Rain, rain go away is my mantra this past week. However, I woke up to a absolutely gorgeously beautiful, sunny day. Feeling great, I whiz through my morning chores and head off for a delicious walk in the park. Following my walk, I arrange to meet Maxine Cintas for lunch and a Chirper interview. Feeling great, all seems like a beautiful Daylight Savings

Time Summer Day. OOPS! I am embarrassed as Maxine informs me that I am an hour early. We accommodate to the situation and I read the morning paper as Maxine finishes preparing for lunch.

Lunch is most enjoyable, however very noisy – not the best for an interview. We return to Maxine's house in Santa Clara where she reveals her secrets for all to read here in the Chirper. She was married to John Cintas for 34-1/2 years. John worked for GE Nuclear in San Jose until heart problems ended his career and eventually took his life in March '03. Maxine has four children (three boys and one girl) and eight grandchildren – all living in California. With an older sister and younger brother, Maxine grew up with her parents in Campbell and graduated from Campbell High.

Out of high school, Maxine took a job at Westinghouse working with personnel. She was responsible for processing insurance claims. In 1970 she left Westinghouse to start a wonderful family and become a stay-at-home mom.

With all sorts of spare time available, Maxine keeps out of mischief by volunteering through her church. She especially enjoys working with people and helping others. She is in charge of two church related ministries – the Good Samaritans and the Food Pantry. Like most of us, Maxine is a collector and has developed a delightful collection of Moonstone and Candle Wick glassware.

Her husband's work involved much world travel and Maxine accompanied him on many of his assignments – Spain, Taiwan, Puerto Rico, and Mexico. They also traveled to Alaska, Canada, and Hawaii. A highlight of her travels was to meet Roy Rogers in person at the Roy Rogers Museum. Now she would like to see much more of our own country.

Oh, oh – don't put out a jigsaw puzzle if Maxine comes to visit. There is always just one more piece to put in. She won't be able to leave until the last piece is in place.

Maxine does not wear much jewelry because it always seems to get in her way. But for likes – ummm, spicy Mexicanfood for her. Oh yes, she has difficulty passing up a good steak no matter how it is prepared.

Since I had this interview with Maxine and before we could print it in the Chirper, we have another news flash. If you haven't already heard, Maxine and Lloyd eloped! While visiting her sister in Arizona, they decided to get married. This occurred on Tuesday afternoon, March 21, in a church nearby. To get a marriage license, all they needed was their drivers' license. Maxine's sister and brother-in-law were their attendants, witnesses and congregation.

Lloyd is in the process of moving into Maxine's home which is just 5 minutes from Kaiser Hospital in Santa Clara where he works. It will be a challenge to get all their stuff under one roof and they are predicting about 6 months to accomplish this great feat!
