Before the dance:

- Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, 408-871-9525 of any needed change to assigned dates.
- Purchase and bring 6 to 8 lbs ice for the water cooler.
- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:30 PM. A Katydid with a key will open the doors.
- Sweep floor as necessary and set up tables and chairs.
- · Make ice water.
- · Start hot water for tea and coffee.

During Club dance:

- · Welcome everyone at the sign-in table.
- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner.
- · Check that water and cups do not run out.

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.


July 26th will be a 'normal' (who says that anything is 'normal' about the Katydids!) Club night.

Square Dancing Is Dying...

Katydids, Square Dancers, Callers and Key Personnel in the Square Dance world who are reading this, I hope I have your attention. However, I am primarily addressing this to my Katydids for it is their support I am seeking. Admittedly even with the support of Katydids, we would certainly need the support of square dancers primarily in the Santa Clara Valley area. The reason will show up as I go through my explanation.

Louise, my wife, and I have been Katydids for 39 years and have been class angels for many of those years. All of us have ideas and reasons why square dancing is dying and many organizations and clubs have tried different teaching orders with little improvement. The one I have not heard is to have a teaching order of Basic to Mainstream only with some modifications. We need one that is really short in the time period so that we can graduate them to join a club Basic or some other level name. That is where we need help from other clubs in the Valley to have same level clubs or junior clubs so that at least we may have hoedowns for the newcomers. We need a class that is short and a junior club that may dance less than once a week.

What this means to the current activity is that we will have dancers who will be calling themselves square dancers but not at the level we are expecting dancers to be...but we will have newer dancers never-the-less. Just give this method a try for several years and it will be smoothed out. We can still have plus and advance dancers but the help needed is in class angels with the dance classes most likely to be held on a non-club night.

I am looking at prospective dancers who are young and dedicated to keep square dancing alive and vibrant. Dancers who can give about 9 months of class dancing, join or form a club of similar backgrounds. Since these dancers are not able to afford weekly dancing perhaps a club can be formed that dances twice a month or just once a month. I was watching these exercise classes held at our YMCA and noticed that many are young and attend these sessions on a regular basis. These sessions are usually of one-hour duration. Perhaps that may be all that these young families are able to afford. These sessions are typically 8 weeks long and they do learn some movements to go with the music. Can we sell aerobic dancers on square dancing for a less strenuous exercise?

Perhaps maybe we should change our format to accommodate new dancers similar to the time allowed for aerobic dancing. Have one hour dance sessions and a class of 8 weeks. What I see in aerobic dancing is the smaller number of men compared to women. If we make a selling point, most men in square dancing will attest to the fact..."try it, you will like it." Another strong selling point will be in the socializing. Especially in Santa Clara County, we must start considering the changing demographics. How can we attract more Chinese, Korean, and Indians? We can tell them that square dancing is alive in China, Japan and Korea. Do we need callers who are Chinese, Korean and Indian? We do need to stress that square dance calls are in English only. If this is the way to go, we must hurry up and start a caller's class to recruit demographically acceptable students. They

must be taught how to dance and learn the calls before they can go solo to teach other classes.

I know I haven't covered everything that needs to be discussed nor have I digressed on every detail but hopefully enough to kindle some fires to get people thinking.

We returned from Belize, Central America last Monday night. I sent my kids a short email every day of our trip. I locked my classroom on Jun 7, and our plane left at 6 AM June 8th. We got right out of Dodge. It was a great get-away. I'd go again in a second.

Belize Report #Day 1) Hi Greg, Mark and friends, All is great.

I don't want to flower it up because Belize is a very poor country. There is poverty, joblessness, trash everywhere. And the ride from the airport to Belmopan (a two-horse little village yet the capital of the country) was not the lush, green, jungle experience I expected. But, like anything, we're getting the hang of it. If a few vital street signs are missing, so be it. People are clean and so so helpful and friendly.

Our first hotel (actually an 8 guests private villa) was hard to find, on a dark, rutted, gravel road. But once there, we couldn't be happier, and we'd recommend it to anyone. The hosts had internet, huge tiled rooms and huge American breakfasts, large clean pool, and other extras. They helped us return the bag that we mistakenly took from the airport thinking it was ours. Ours was still waiting at the airport the next day. On the way back to Belmopan, we stopped at the zoo to see the native, wild animals we probably won't see in the open as they stay out of sight (even though we drive through their corridor).

Food is good. Belikin brand beer is excellent.

We scheduled a cave-tubing tour for tomorrow so stay tuned.

Today we did cave-tubing at St. Herman's Cave. The cave was an important ritual and ceremonial site during the Mayan Period. Pottery vessels, spears, and torches have been recovered from the cave. Jim and I hired a private tour guide to take us through the cave completely, seeing beautiful formations and Mayan artifacts - some possibly 2000 years old or older. There is a river through the cave system. So we let the current float us most peacefully for 1 1/2 hours on our inner tubes. It was pitch black dark except for the light from our head flashlights. What a great day!

Then on to San Ignacio in the heart of the jungle.
