## Before the dance:

- Notify the Super Square Head, Steph Stevens, 408-871-9525 of any needed change to assigned dates.
- Purchase and bring 6 to 8 lbs ice for the water cooler.
- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:30 PM. A Katydid with a key will open the doors.
- Sweep floor as necessary and set up tables and chairs.
- Make ice water.
- Start hot water for tea and coffee.


## During Club dance:

- Welcome everyone at the sign-in table.
- Collect a $\mathbf{\$ 5 . 0 0}$ donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for $\$ 1.00$.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds - 50\% to the Club, $50 \%$ to the winner.
- Check that water and cups do not run out.

The Food Pantry was very active in 2011. Although there were fewer visits than the previous year, we had very few "no visit" days. There were 350 visits during the year, serving 124 individual adults and 96 children.

Significantly fewer visits, but almost the identical number of children served, shows that "adult only" households and the homeless were in greater need of our help. This may reflect an inability of other agencies to supply those needs as well as they previously have.

I consider it an honor to have occasionally been able to provide minimal counsel to those who needed a listening ear and it has been extremely rewarding to share my faith with seekers, and to share with Jesus followers as ministered to their physical needs.

Thank you all for enabling me to participate in this ministry. Your gifts, in-kind, financial and prayerful, keep it going.

$: 1 \mathrm{pkg}$ chocolate cake mix (NOT a pudding mix)
$: 1$ small pkg instant vanilla pudding mix
: 2 c. sour cream
: 2 eggs
: $1 / 4 \mathrm{c}$. canola oil

- $1 / 2 \mathrm{c}$. Kahlua
: 6 oz pkg semi sweet chocolate chips
: Confectioner's sugar
- Preheat oven to $350^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$
: Combine cake mix, pudding mix, sour cream, eggs, oil : and Kahlua, using an electric mixer. Stir in chocolate : pieces.
: Pour into a greased Bundt pan. Bake for approximately : 45 minutes. Cool in pan for 10 minutes.

Invert over plate and dust with confectioner’s sugar.
